

HARCOURT, RICHARD, M.A. (*Monck.*)

Third s. of Michael Harcourt, who was twice elected for Haldimand Co. in the old Parlt. of Can. B. in Tp. of Seneca, Haldimand Co. 1849. Is a graduate and medallist of Toronto Univ. M., 1876, Augusta H., dan. of the late Jacob Young. Public School Inspector for Haldimand Co. for five years. Called to the Bar, Ont., in 1876. Was Deputy-Judge of the Co. of Welland, 1886, during absence of County Judge. First elected to the Leg. Assem. of Ont. Dec. 1878. Re-elected at g. e. 1879, 1883, and 1886. A Liberal.—*Welland, Ont.*

X HARDY, Hon. ARTHUR STURGIS, Q.C. (*South Brant.*)

Descended on both sides from U. E. Loyalists. S. of Russell Hardy, Esq., merchant, Brantford, Ont. B. at Mount Pleasant, Ont., 14 Dec., 1837. Ed. at Rockwood Academy and at Co. Brant Grammar Sch. M., 10 Jan. 1870, Mary, dau. of the late Hon. Mr. Justice Morrison, of Toronto. Called to the Bar of Ont., Easter Term, 1865. Apptd. a Q.C., 1876. Is a Bencher of the Law Soc., Ont. First returned to Leg. Assem., for present seat, April 1873, on resignation of sitting mem. Re-elected by acclamation at g. e. 1875. Apptd. Provl. Secy. and Registrar, March 1877, and re-elected by acclamation. Re-elected at g. e. 1879, 1883, and again at last g. e. A Liberal.—*Brantford; Toronto; Toronto Club.*

HESS, JOHN GEORGE. (*North Perth.*)

Grandfather was proprietor of a woollen mill in Beerfelden, Grand Duchy of Hessen, Germany. Father succeeded him in the business, but having compromised himself in the Revolution of 1848, found it necessary to emigrate to Can. B. in Beerfelden, 3 Nov. 1838, and ed. there. M., 16 Nov., 1860, Miss Elizabeth Hueffner. Is a furniture manufacturer. Was in the Council and is now Mayor of Listowel. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g. e. 1883, and re-elected at last g. e. A Conservative.—*Listowel.*

HILLIARD, DANIEL. (*North Lanark.*)

Family, originally from the North of Eng., settled in N. Y. State. Father emigrated to Can. from Plattsburg, N. Y. B. in Prescott, Ont., and ed. there and in Toronto. M., 1849, Jane, dau. of the late Sheriff Dickson, of Paken-
