*Governor-General**—His Excellency the Right Honorable Sir FREDERICK ARTHUR STANLEY, G.C.B., Baron Stanley of Preston, first Baron, P. C., second son of fourteenth Earl of Derby, K.G., b. 15 Jan., 1841; ed. at Eton; formerly Captain Grenadier Guards; is Honorary Colonel 3rd and 4th Battalion King's Own (Royal Lancaster Regiment), a supernumerary A. D. C. to Her Majesty, and a J. P. for Lancashire and Westmoreland; was Civil Lord of the Admiralty Aug. to Nov., 1868; Financial Secretary to War Office 1874-7; Secretary to Treasury to 1878-8; Secretary of State for War 1878-80; Secretary of State for Colonies 1885-6, and President of Board of Trade 1886-8, since when he has been Governor-General of Canada and Commander-in-Chief of Prince Edward Island; P. C. 1878. Sat as M. P. for Preston (C.) 1865-8, for North Lancashire 1868-85 and for Blackpool division of Lancashire N. 1885-6. Created Baron Stanley of Preston (peerage of United Kingdom) 1886. M. 31 May, 1864, Lady Constance Villiers, eldest dau. of fourth Earl of Clarendon, K.G. Apptd. 1 May; sworn in 11 June, 1888. (Salary £10,000 *stg.*) *Government House, Ottawa,*
