DRESS AND HEALTH.

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INTRODUCTORY.

Dress Reform and Dress Emancipation are expressions odious beyond measure to the mind of a large majority of the cultivated and refined women of the day. Why is this? Because the expression seems to them to savor of the ill-odored "Woman's Rights" movement. Because it brings up reminiscences of the days when certain women. more brave than wise, attempted to lead a movement for the deliverance of their sex from the thraldom of dress by the adoption of the costume, which satisfied "bloomer" womanly taste nor womanly dignity; and because, farther, certain reformers of the present day have appeared in a mannish garb which has caused people to cry out in disgust "They want to dress like men." For these reasons the idea of dressreform is a hateful one, though few thoughtful women will refuse to acknowledge that the present style of dress is not only uncomfortable but unhealthful and really burdensome. The idea that
