


The Navy team kept pressing until finally MacLeod received an eighteen-yard pass in the end zone for Cornwallis' first and only five points. The attempted convert was blocked.


In the same quarter Scott Hendwhite line for a T. D. from the 7-yard-line. Cluney kicked the con-vert for the final point of the game. 40


