Limb, or receiving a wound } in Money or Presents
equal to Loss of Limb.

To the Widow or Family of a } A present of 200 Dol
Chief, Killed in Action, or } in Money or Goods.
dying of his Wounds.

To the Widow or Family of a } A present of 150
Warrior, Killed in Action, } Dollars in Money or Goods
or dying of his Wounds.

The Board is of opinion the
Indians ought to be entitled to Prize
Money for the Capture of Detroit in the

Chiefs as Subalterns.

Warriors as Privates.

The Head Money for Prisoners
of War brought in by the Indian Warriors
is to be immediately paid by the Commissary
upon the Certificate of the General Officer
Commanding the Division, with which
they are acting at the time.
