A Proclamation

Whereas Thave Sumoned the Indians of the five nations to meet me at this place to treat with them about publish affairs Some of them being arrive at Schinectaday and this day expected here and it being found by Experience that the Selling or givening of Rum and other Strong Liquor to those Indians hath been of Dangerous Consequence and very prejudiciall to his maje st Interest and the Lublich welfare of the Inhabitants of this place I howe therefore thought fitt by vertue of the powers and authorities in me Leside= ing here by Strictly to prohibit the giveing or Selling of any hum or other Strong Liquor to any Indian or Indian's Dureing my Residence in this City and County and that no person or pesons Shall Receive buy or take in paun any goods to be given as presents to the Indians on penalty to be prosecuted with of attenost Severity for any Such mesomeanons and all Magistrates and Justices of the peace in this city and country are horeby Required to take fare that this proclamation be ducly observed and the Delinquents brought to Condign punishment Given under my hand and Seal this 2. day of September in the 13th year of his Majesties Reign Anno Domini 1>26
