Dear Sir :-

The Winnipeg Board of Trade has been considering for a lengthy period the need for consolidation in Civil Service of the Dominion Government. They find that their views on the matter are very properly set forth in the report of the Special Committee of the Senate on the Civil Service of which the Honourable Senator Beique was Chairman, and which report was adopted on the 16th July, 1924.

In Section 24 of that report the Committee made certain recommendations and suggestions with a view to further economies and efficiency in the Civil Service.

With the facilities available to the Senate Committee and the knowledge and standing of the members of that Committee, we are convinced that their recommendations are founded on actual knowledge of the facts. We, therefore, ask that you as the leader of the Dominion Government give careful consideration to the recommendations contained in this Senate report, as we are agreed that many economies can be effected and considerable improvement in the efficiency of the Civil Service secured if these recommendations are carried out.
