No. 220. Most Secret. Personal for the Prime Minister. Foreign Office is in possession of no official information which might confirm today's newspaper reports of diplomatic developments in France.

Consideration is being given here to a clarification of relations between the Netherlands East Indies and United Kingdom Government, and it is likely that there will be a formal agreement to come to each others aid in the event of Japanese attack. This is, of course, the de facto state of affairs at present.
