WINNALL, ERIC IVAN—Captain. Born 15th January, 1891, at London, England. Father, Harry Winnall, Insurance Agent. Educated at St. Paul's, London, England. Entered the service of the Bank, 1st March, 1912, from Eastern Townships Bank. Enlisted, 4th June, 1915, from Bedford branch, in 42nd Canadian Battalion, with the rank of Private. Transferred to 9th Buffs (East Kent Regiment), as Second Lieutenant; and subsequently to 33rd Punjabis Regiment. Promoted Captain. On active service in France, attached to 2nd Queen's Royal West Surrey Regiment. Service in India from December, 1917. Gun shot wound in the left arm, 4th April, 1917.

WINNING, HAROLD ANDERSON—Private. Born 25th March, 1894, at Toronto, Ontario, Canada. Father, John A. Winning, Insurance Agent (deceased). Educated at Toronto Public School, Harbord Collegiate Institute and Technical High School. Entered the service of the Bank, 20th January, 1914. Enlisted, 7th March, 1916, from Yonge & Queen, Toronto, branch, in 75th Canadian Battalion, with the rank of Private. Principal actions: Vimy Ridge, Hill 70, Passchendaele, 1917. Gassed, November, 1917. Demobilized, 7th July, 1919. Returned to duty with the Bank, 2nd September, 1919.

WINNING, JAMES PATON—Sergeant, M.S.M. Born 16th February, 1893, at Kilmarnock, Scotland. Father, Martin Winning, Engineer. Educated at Kilmarnock Academy. Entered the service of the Bank, 2nd November, 1911. Enlisted, 7th November, 1914, from Bengough branch, in 20th Border Horse, with the rank of Private. Transferred to 32nd Canadian Battalion, 30th November, 1914; 10th Canadian Battalion, 26th April, 1915; No. 1 Canadian Field Ambulance, 17th December, 1915; attached 1st Canadian Divisional Headquarters, July, 1917. Promoted Sergeant, 19th March, 1917. Principal actions: Festubert, 1915; Sanctuary Wood, Somme, 1916; Vimy Ridge (with Field Ambulance); Hill 70, Passchendaele, 1917; "Llandoverly Castle" operations, Drocourt-Quéant Line, Cambrai, 1918.
