OSTOBER.—Of calves and colts let us say a few words:—Wean calves gradually; restrict their allowance to one teat per day, then allow them to suck only a part of the milk in one teat. After a few days longer, let them suck only once a day for a week, then once in two days for a week, then once in three days. By this time, with proper management, they may be weaned without injury either to dam or calf. Spring colts as well as calves should be weaned generally in August; confine them in a small, clean enclosure, where they cannot run much, and let them suck twice a day, then once, then once in two days, then once in three days. See that colts and calves do not lack a good supply of clean water and good grass, or fine hay, and a sufficiency of, but not too much salt.
