with the Address of this House, requesting he would be pleased to order an advance of one hundred pounds to be made to the Clerk of this House, on account of the contingent expences of the present Session, and that his Honor had been pleased to say he would comply with the wishes of the House.

An ingrossed Bill further to continue an Act for making a temporary provision for the regulation of trade, between this Province and the *United States* of *America*, &c. was read for the third time.

On motion of Mr. Berthelet, seconded by Mr. Roy Portelance,

RESOLVED, That the Bill do pass, and that the title be, An Act further to continue for a limited time, an Act passed in the thirty-sixth year of his Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act for making a temporary provision for the regulation of trade between this Province and the *United States* of *America*, by land or inland navigation."

ORDERED, That Mr. Young do carry the Bill to the Legislative Council and defire their concurrence.

On motion of Mr. Planté, seconded by Mr. Berthelot,

ORDERED, That it be an inftruction to the Committee, to whom was referred the Bill concerning the Maitres and Aides de Poste in this Province, to reduce into one Bill, all the Ordinances of the Legislative Council and the Acts of the Provincial Parliament, regarding the said Maitres and Aides de Poste; with such amendments as they may deem expedient.

And then, on motion of Mr. Berthelot, seconded by Mr. Roy Por-telance,

The House adjourned to Monday next.
