XIV. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the money hereby in discharge of warrt. granted to His Majesty, shall be paid by the Receiver General, in discharge of such warrant or warrants, as shall for the purpose herein set forth be issued by the Governor, Lieut. Governor, or person administering the Government of this Province, and shall be accounted for by the Receiver General of this Province, to His Mathe Lords Commissioners of His Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, shall be graciously pleased to direct.

CHAP. XL.

An Act to appropriate a Sum of Money to defray the expences of any Commission for ascertaining Titles to Lands in the Niagara District, which shall or may be authorised by any Act of the Parliament of this Province.

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,

Preamble.
