Northcliffe's offense was to do his patriotic duty and tell the English people that their valor was being wasted because the men did not have the proper tools for their work. In June, the British lost 64,200 men and gained nothing. Northcliffe says it is because they are fighting with shrapnel and rifles against explosive shell and machine guns. Explosive shells wreck trenches, shrapnel sprinkles

Northcliffe's newspapers have not given comfort or aid to the enemy but they have given discomfort and tried to give aid to the English. For that reason their director is regarded as something nearly a traitor. He would be in the Tower of London if some people he had offended had their way, and we suspect that the final injustice will be that when the methods he advocates have been adopted he will remain unforgiven for urging
