INITIATIVE PASSING NOW TO RUSSIANS

As Result of Summer's Cam-
paign in East, Germany
Has Failed.

Petrograd, Oct. 14.—The situation
on the Russian front is growing bet-
ter every day. The German offensive
is paralyzed, and the Russians are
gradually recovering the initiative. As
the result of the five months' cam-
paign the Germans not only have not
made a supreme effort on the Russian
army to its knees, but also have failed
even to reach a secure line
entrenching themselves on which for
the winter they could concentrate
their main efforts on other fronts.

It so happened the other fronts
claim the most earnest attention at
the moment when the German front
in Russia is most advantageously placed
between two strong fortifications and
when the Russian army to a large extent
has regained its striking power. The
Germans hoped to shake off the
supreme effort on the Russian front
by the seizure of the Dnieper and to
establish themselves firmly on the
strong line of the Dvina, Bereznina
and Dnieper, but their calculations
have been falsified at the exact psy-
chological moment, when the allies
struck hard in the west, and the grow-
ing exhaustion of Turkey necessitates
a supreme effort on the part of Ger-
many in the Balkans.

The clear and prolonged offensive
of the Central European powers is
being turned into a complex and
many sided defensive. To free them-
selves in Russia the Germans must
push forward the centre beyond the
swamp region and secure their flanks.
They must take the initiative and
seize Dvinsk and the Dvina and push
on to the Dnieper, but they attempted
both tasks in vain.

HELD UP AT DVINSK

At Dvinsk the enemy has been held
at bay 27 days. He lost heavily in re-
peated frontal attacks. At certain
points he has advanced within five or
six miles of the town, but during the
last few days has been forced back
to the former ten-mile distance, and
his attacks continually melt away un-
der the Russian fire.

Despairing of effecting anything by
further frontal attacks, Gen. Buelow
is now trying to force his way
through the forest of the Dvina. The
Germans did succeed in capturing the
important position of Gorbatovka, near
the river bank, but immediately
were thrown out again near Iluxum,
a stretch of open country between
dense forests. The Russians have
driven the Germans out of the
trenches and south of the Dvinsk a
stiff battle is proceeding around Novo
Alexandrovska.

Add to this fact that on the line
of the lakes running parallel with
the Vlna-Dvinsk railway the Rus-
sians are slowly but surely advan-
cing, and it will be seen that the en-
emy's hope of forcing the Dvina is
certainly no brighter than it was a
month ago. One sign of improve-

SUCCESS IN GALICIA.

Zepps Raid London

London, Oct. 14.—Zeppelin airships
have made another raid over London,
dropping bombs. Eight persons are
declared to have been killed and about
thirty four injured. The material dam-
age done is said to have been small.

The Home Office shortly after mid-
night made the following report on
the raid.

A Zeppelin raid was made Wednes-
day evening over a portion of the
London area, when a certain number
of incendiary and explosive bombs
were dropped. The material damage
done was small. A few fires resulted,
but they were quickly put out by the
fire brigade. The Admiralty will issue
a statement to-day when particulars
are available.

"At present it is only possible to
say that no public buildings were in-
jured and that the casualties so far
reported number two women and six
men killed and about thirty-four in-
jured. With the exception of a sol-
dier killed, all these were civilians.
"These figures include all the casu-
alties reported at 11.45 o'clock Wed-
nesday evening."
