Development Work Will Be Pushed at Once and as Rapidly as Possible.

Lew Craden, the broker who promoted the purchase of the Lone Star group of quartz claims at the head of Victoria gulch, returned from a visit to the properties this morning. are already on foot for pushing the work of developing the Lone Star, of the outlook for which Mr. Craden is extremely sanguine. As soon as the necessary arrangements are perfected, a new tunnel will be started from the Victoria side, which is expected to tap the ledge at a depth of 175 feet. The greatest depth thus far attained is 54 feet, beyond which it has been impossible to go owing to the fact that a natural water channel follows the lead and it has been impossible to keep the shafts dry. The contemplated tunnel when completed will form a drain by which the water will be carried off.
