DEMAND COOL CURED CHEESE.

Cheese Factories Deriving Profit from Using Process.

The System Adopted by the Government.

Higher Prices Obtained Than for the Ordinary Cured Cheese.

Judging from the greater demand for cool cured cheese which exists this season, the Old Country merchants are beginning to realize more fully the advantage there is in handling cheese which have not been exposed during the process of curing to a temperature higher than sixty degrees.

The experience gained at the Government cool curing rooms has demonstrated that, while the first requisite is to control the temperature, it is also necessary to provide for some circulation of the air to carry off the moisture which escapes from the cheese, and which comes from the increased relative humidity due to the reduction of temperature.

The system adopted at the Government curing rooms has worked admirably, and it can be employed without difficulty and at a modern cost in connection with any cheese factory.
