AN ONTARIO TRAGEDY.

A Frenzied Husband Shoots His Mother-in-Law and Then Ends His Own Life.

ARVA, Ont., June 10.—Robert Fulford, arrived on Saturday afternoon and driving to the farm of Robert McCord demanded from Mrs. McCord the whereabouts of his wife, daughter of the former, who had recently left her husband and returned home. Mrs. McCord, who was milking, said she was not there, whereupon Fulford drew two revolvers and began shooting. Two shots entered the woman's head and two more penetrated her thigh. When she dropped at his feet, he turned the weapon on himself and

emptied three chambers into his mouth before he fell. Mr. McCord hearing the shots ran out and made for the assassin, but fell at the feet of his dead wife and expired instantly from heart failure.

For some years Fulford and his wife, Gertrude McCord, lived in St. Louis, Mo. Fulford, however, was a heavy drinker and treated his wife so cruelly that she finally left him and returned home, but had been sent to stay with a friend at St. Mary's for safety, as her husband threatened to follow and kill her.
