WINNIPEG MARKET LETTER

(Thompson, Sons & Co.)

Nothing of special importance has occurred in the Winnipeg market in the past week. Demand has not been keen, nor have bidders pressed their wheat for sale. In the fore part of the week trading was slack, and it was reported that the government buyers seemed at times to be waiting to get or keep prices down, but the trade has been small in volume, and the feeling is that all our wheat will be needed before another harvest. Receipts have been very small for some days, but for the last three days over the west weather has been very fine and mild, and the railways are again rushing the movement for the time being. Today's prices are 1 Nor. 177 1/2c, 2 Nor. 174 1/2c, 3 Nor. 169 1/2c, No. 4 156c, No. 5 150c. Feed 90c. Futures closed, May 184c, July 179 1/2c.

Oats—A good demand for oats at about last week's prices. Today's prices: 2 C.W. 54 1/2c, 3 C.W. 51 1/2c, extra 1 feed 51 1/2c, 1 feed 50 1/2c, 2 feed 49 1/2c. The May future closed at 59 1/2c. Barley—Barley is in fair demand at 1c under the prices for this day last week for cash and 1c higher on May. No. 3 97c, No. 4 19c, rejected 72c, feed 72c. The May future closed 101c.

TORONTO LIVESTOCK

Toronto, Jan. 4.—Receipts at the Union stockyard, today were 587 cattle, 163 calves, 2,061 hogs, 398 sheep and lambs.

Owing to many cattle arriving late this morning the market was held over a little longer today. There was not a great deal of interest taken in the common and medium grades, but all were cleaned up at the week's levels. Good to choice killers and other good grades were steady. Choice steers, while not plentiful, were to be found on the market. Butcher bulls and fat cows met a ready sale. Canners and cutters were a little slower today owing to the fact that two of the large packers refused to buy any of this grade. Stockers and feeders scarce. Light sheep were in good demand. The demand for lambs continued active. Hogs steady.

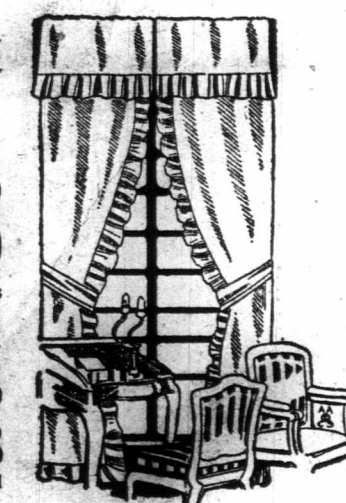
