Demand has not been keen, nor have holders pressed their wheat for sale. In the lore part of the week trading was slack, and it was reported that the government buyers seemed at times to be working to get or keep prices down, but the trade has been small in volume, and the feeling is that all our wheat will be needed before another harvest. Receipts have been very small for some days, but for the last three days over the west weather has been very fine and mild, and the railways are again rushing the movement for the time being. 


