Vancouver, March 10.—The estimate of the expenditure of the Province of British Columbia for the fiscal year ending March 31st, 1911, were brought down by the Minister of Finance, Hon. W. Bowser. The total amount asked for was \$7,388,257.11, together with a statutory obligation on account of the guarantee of three sets of railway bonds estimated to call for \$40,000 this year, or a sum of \$7,778,257.11. The aggregate amount asked for for the year now drawing to a close was \$5,655,798.11, so that there is an increase in the estimated expenditures of the Province for the coming fiscal year of over two million dollars more than the current year.

The supplementary estimates are slightly larger than those of last year. For the current fiscal year there are needed \$1,281,302.46, and for some of the ends of account for the fiscal year of 1908-09 there is required a further sum of \$7,671.63. The sum total of the estimates to be voted this session is therefore \$9,099,231.20, which, when compared with the total vote of \$6,839,537.12 last year, is certainly making the money fly, and the new holders of the portfolio of Finance are credited with having said
