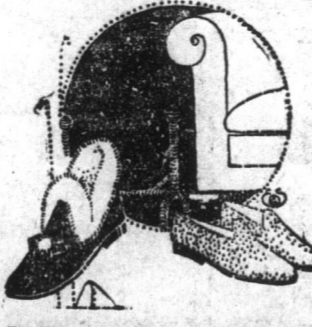

Literati Discuss Delinquent Boys.

"Resolved—That there should be a state industrial school for delinquent boys" was the subject of debate at the Methodist College Literary Institute last night. Rev. W. B. Bugden and Messrs. C. F. Scott and J. M. Barbour led the affirmatives, while the negative side was led by Rev. Dr. Fenwick and Messrs. A. Hayward and Walter Sparkes. The affirmative showed that industrial schools for delinquents have been absolutely a success. There were delinquent boys in our country, investigation from police circles showed what school teachers and employers had said to be true, viz., that boys skip school and work, and become delinquents. Moreover there is no place at present to send these boys except to the penitentiary where the functions of a reformatory are entirely absent. The study of child life has shown that in the case of delinquent boys, prevention is better than cure. It is harder to cure a criminal man than it is to correct a delinquent boy. It is also much more extravagant financially, for such delinquencies invariably are centered in future generations. Other points were also dealt with, and figures of delin- quency given. The negative contended that reports of delinquency in Newfoundland were grossly exaggerated, and that an analysis the number was really so small that no one could honestly expect the government to inaugurate an expensive institution for the sake of the few real criminal boys in our midst. All our juvenile offenders are not and never will be criminals. There are other institutions besides an industrial school. The affirmative was advocating a reformatory, which is next door to a jail. The debate was "Industrial School." The debate was not the question of value of industrial schools, or their importance, that is undoubted. The question is whether or not they should be state-owned. The negative was not prepared to establish state industrial schools for delinquents. It was prepared to have such schools under the management of our educational authorities, in collaboration with our other schools. Such an institution would appeal to boys not now enticed by school books, and keep them away from temptation. Other issues were also raised by the negative. Next week there will be no debate, but on the 19th inst. the subject will be "Resolved—that woman suffrage be in England, should become the law of Newfoundland during the life time of the present parliament."

Jones for the use of their rooms, and many other kindnesses; and the Press for its generous assistance. After a hearty vote of thanks to His Excellency the Governor, the meeting closed at 4.30 p.m.
