 at the time of his death.

Leonard Trainor, Daniel Bugale and  
 Geo. Fazio, all Italians, were arrested  
 Monday by a C.P.R. detective for stealing  
 a freight train from Edmonton.  
 They were brought before Inspector  
 Durfee Tuesday at the barracks and the  
 two first named were sentenced to 34  
 days in jail, and the third, Geo. Fazio,  
 was sentenced to a month and 14 days,

The yearly statement of the customs  
 department which has just been made  
 out is convincing evidence of Calgary's  
 rapid growth and industrial expansion  
 during the last year. For the year  
 1911-1912 the returns were \$1,832,948.92  
 and for the year 1912-1913 the returns  
 were \$2,301,166.57. This is equivalent  
 to an increase of nearly 25 percent,  
 which is admitted to be a phenomenal  
 increase in custom house statistics of  
 this city.

Provinces Preferable to  
 STATES, SAYS PREMIER  
 OF W. AUSTRALIA

Winnipeg, April 2.—Speaking at a  
 Canadian convention today, Hon.  
 John S. G. Macdonald, premier of West Aus-  
 tralia, said that it would be a better  
 thing for the continent if the various  
 provinces instead of states and a central  
 government similar to the Canadian  
 system. This change was brought about  
 because, and it was only a question of  
 time until it was found that in  
 Canada would be found in Australia.

Western Australia, he said, had been  
 able to make progress under the pro-  
 tection of the Union Jack, although  
 when in Australia, in other parts of  
 the empire, there were those who did  
 not fully appreciate what the protec-  
 tion afforded by the Union Jack meant  
 to their country.
