Karl II. was the son of the famous Duke of Brunswick, who fell at Waterloo, and, with his brother, was left to the guardianship of King George IV He proved a hopelessly dissolute prince, devoting his time to prodigality and the accumulation of precious stones, of which he left one of the finest collections in the world. He died in 1873 at Geneva, leaving a portion of his immense fortune to that town on the condition that a statute
