## JACK THE HUGGER IS NOT GUILTY

Jury So Finds After Hearing the Evidence--Kerr Sentenced to Jail for Five Months.

HAD GOOD CHARACTER.

The Circuit Court concluded its sitting at Dalhousie Thursday afternoon.

There were three criminal cases. The King vs. McDonald. The King vs. Kerr. The King vs. Chisholm.

Much interest was taken in the case of the King vs. McDonald. This was for indecent assault. The defendant, it was alleged, had for some time been in the habit of waylaying young girls, chasing them and taking hold of them. He was arrested at the magistrate's court building; evidence was submitted to warrant his being sent up for trial. At the court trial only one witness, besides the Chief of Police, was examined and the material evidence, in the opinion of the jury, was not sufficient to convict. A. E. Blanc for defendant.

## VALLEY RAILROAD PROJECT FAVORED

Resolution Passed at the Union of Municipalities Meeting at Moncton.

EXPORT OF PULP WOOD.

MONCTON, Mar. 11.—At this morning's meeting of the Municipalities Union the following resolution, moved by Mayor E. McDonald, Shelburne, and seconded by Mayor Murray, of Campbellton, was carried unanimously after a brief discussion:

That we memorialize the provincial legislature to amend the towns and municipalities incorporation act so as to provide that councils may exempt from taxation new industries acting as a phony of the electors has been taken, a majority of said electors being favorable to said exemption.

The matter of the maintenance of pauper inmates, left over from last evening, was next brought up; the following resolution being introduced: "That this convention do urge again upon the government of New Brunswick the necessity of carefully considering the question of maintenance of harmless pauper inmates who have not gained a residence in any city, town or municipality in the province."

A vote of thanks was moved to Aid. Betty for his paper on delinquents and the regular morning programme was then taken up.

The first was the pulpwood question, under the heading "Shedding the burden of a heavy export duty on pulpwood." Resolutions passed by the York and Northumberland councils were introduced and Dr. Stirling of York moved that they be endorsed, seconded by Mayor McDonald of Chatham. That of York county provided for a prohibitive export duty on pulpwood and that the Northumberland urged a prohibition of the export of raw timber.

Delegates from Charlotte endorsed that suggestion would be detrimental to industries in their county, other speakers claiming that the prohibition of pulpwood export would force the Maine mills to move into New Brunswick. The matter was thrashed out at length. Coun. Atchley, of York, finally introducing an amendment that the convention place itself on record as being opposed to the export of both pulp and sawwood and memorialize the government to that effect.

Other delegates thought that was going too far and Coun. Reid of Port Elgin, moved another amendment that the resolution of the Northumberland county council be endorsed. Finally it was decided to have delegates retire and prepare a resolution, which was done.

On motion of Mayor J. D. St. John, the regular order of business was suspended while the question of the St. John River Valley Railway was taken up. Mr. St. John, of Fredericton moving the following resolution:

That this convention is heartily in sympathy with the effort being made by the residents of the St. John River Valley to obtain railway communication between a point at near Grand Falls and St. John to the river and would respectfully urge upon the federal and provincial governments the desirability of granting any reasonable aid in connection with this project. This was seconded by Mr. St. John, of York, both he and Mayor Chisholm supporting the resolution with strong addresses. The motion passed unanimously.

The King vs. Kerr.—This was for theft. The accused was charged with taking \$25 from a passenger on the Maritime Express some time ago. He was arrested, and practically admitted his guilt. The jury found him guilty but recommended him to the mercy of the Judge. Mr. A. E. McKenzie, his lawyer, who handled the case very cleverly, produced letters and telegrams from Chatham parties, where Kerr had been, stating that he always had a good character and under these circumstances the Judge sentenced him to five months in the Dalhousie Jail, with hard labor.

In the case of the King vs. Chisholm the jury acquitted him. A. T. Le-land for defendant.
