ROOM FOR EXPANSION

Home Industry Suffers to Extent of Over a Million Dollars a Day

That the Canadian manufacturer has still a long way to go, before he will be in a position to secure the bulk of the trade of the home market against his aggressive American competitor is apparent from figures recently issued at Washington. The value of merchandise exported to Canada from the United States during the 244 days from January 1 to August 31, 1912, is practically \$244,000,000, or, to be more exact, \$243,721,771, or approximately \$1,000,000 a day. In the corresponding eight months of 1909 the value of merchandise exported to Canada was \$180,424,582, or an average of a half-million dollars a day, the total value of exports to Canada having thus doubled in the three years in question.

Comparing the exports in the fiscal year 1912 with those of 1909, bituminous coal shows a growth of over \$10,000,000—from \$15,826,019 in 1909 to \$26,017,403 in 1912. Notable increases occurred in steel rails, which advanced from \$745,535 to \$3,369,894; structural iron and steel from \$1,585,137 to \$1,150,353; agricultural implements from \$2,219,556 to \$6,347,082, the chief growth under this head occurring in exports of plows, which increased from \$79,829 in 1909 to \$1,700,045 in 1912.

Of automobiles the growth in exports to Canada has been especially marked, their value, including parts, in 1912, \$9,363,247, against \$1,687,438. It is just a question whether a young country like Canada can become a highly developed nation if it allows an aggressive trade competitor like the United States to exploit its home market in lines which can advantageously be made in Canada. That policy is the right one which would cause this million dollars a day to be spent in Canada among Canadian workmen.

The Trade returns of Canada up to 1911 show that Canada imported in textile goods 66 per cent. of its total consumption. This means that the textile factories of Canada are making only enough goods of that class to supply our needs for four months of the year. In woollen goods we imported 75 per cent. of our total consumption which shows that the woollen factories of our own land made just enough woollens to supply our needs for three months in the year. This condition of the textile industry suggests a thorough investigation before there is any change in existing duties.

NAVAL GUNNERY

How Style to be Adopted by British as Result of Tests

To settle the question of the superiority of Sir Percy Scott's system of naval fire control over that hitherto in use, trials were carried out with 13.5 guns by the battleships Thunderer and Orion, the former being fitted with the new system and the latter with the old, at a range of 10,000 yards. The Thunderer made five times as many hits as the Orion, thus definitely establishing the superiority of Sir Percy Scott's system. The vessels are sister ships, with the same sea characteristics, the same equipment, and the same types of guns. The firing was delayed until the seas were rough, and then the two vessels were directed by signal to discharge broadsides at two target. The accuracy of the firing of the Thunderer in the unfavorable conditions which prevailed was phenomenal.

It is understood the new system will be fitted to all armoured ships with the least possible delay.

OLD SOLDIER'S VOW

Since Crimean War he Adhered to Pledge Made to His Conscience

Many weird vows have at one time or another been made by persons on finding themselves in great danger or in desperation of ever securing some desired object but one of the most peculiar was made by a French soldier who served in the Crimean war. When he was in the trenches before Sebastopol suffering from the bitter frosts, while his comrades were being decimated by disease, Michel Goets swore that if he returned safe and sound to his native village he would never marry and never accept a pension or any help from anybody.

When he returned to Alsace he kept his vow, refusing to marry, no matter how much his family pressed him to, and rejecting all pecuniary assistance even when old age came upon him and restricted his powers of working. As an old Crimean soldier he was entitled to a pension of \$120 a year, but he would not take it, nor when Alsace was incorporated in Germany would he apply for the annuity granted to old French soldiers. However great the sufferings he had to endure as a consequence of this rigid fulfillment of his vow, he was never heard to complain. He attended without fail to his daily work, and now found him lying on his pallet covered with the death shroud.

Once more he went over his memories of the Crimean war; once more he recalled the praises of his colonel, the idol of his life, and then went to join him."
