

His Grace Archbishop-elect Walsh has addressed this pastoral letter to the clergy, religious communities and laity of the Diocese of London on the eve of his departure for Tor-

"The tie that bind us to the Diocese of London is the closest and most intimate. We have spent the best part of our sacerdotal life amongst you. Twenty-two years form a long period in a minister's life. We have seen the great majority of the priests of the diocese, and raised them to participation in the eternal priesthood of Christ. This is an unique and sacred relationship between priests and their bishop. It is a bond that can never be broken. We have given the sacrament of confirmation to so many generations of our young people, thereby strengthening them in the profession and practice of the faith, and marking them with an ineffaceable character as soldiers of Christ. We have been the spiritual fathers of our churches and institutions to the glory of God and for the purposes of religion. In a word

"We can never forget you; we are deeply grateful for all your kindnesses; we love you as in the past. We are united in prayer with heartfelt fervor. For you are in love with the saints, and you are united with them in heart to the Father and to the Holy Spirit. (II Cor. vii. 13.)

"We are united in prayer with heartfelt fervor, and we shall not fail, in time, to ask that the 'Grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God the Father and the Holy Spirit may be with you all' (II Cor. vii. 13).

"As a good, just, and holy bishop, the one who created bishops that God might give to a diocese, it is incumbent on priests to be zealous of the good of the diocese, and religious and faithful to this diocese to offer to God the sacrifice of praise, thanksgiving, and prayer, and to be zealous that He, in his bounty and goodness, may send them a bishop according to His own heart. For this reason we request of the Holy Father that He will be pleased to send the Holy Man, wherever the Rabbis permit, to the appointment of our successor."

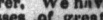
