Another Scram from the Eagle. The World coincides with the Chicago Inter-Ocean that the time has come when the relations of the Dominion with the United States must be re-estimated, but it cannot agree with its claim that the Republic has lived in religious observance of its treaties. One can wish that our relations with our neighbor, and its petty acts of unfriendliness are beginning to prove, like the Chinese custom, more destructive in the long run than the invasion of Canada by Fenians from their country in 1860.

A large amount of American silver is now being circulated, especially "standard dollars," which are intrinsically only worth 95c. in the United States. The public should understand that the banks will not receive them on deposit, and if they pass from hand to hand the last holder will naturally be the loser. The safe course is to refuse them altogether, but under no circumstances should they be taken at a higher rate than 90c.
