EMBEZZLER OF G.T.R. FUNDS AR-RESTED AT ST. LOUIS.

His Companion in Flight Not Yet Caught, But His Whereabouts Known-Frases Will Beturn to the City Voluntarily-Tired of Exile He Makes Overtures to the G.T.R. and the Guarantee Co.

John G. Fraser, clerk in the employ of Mr. J.A. Carlaw, local cashier of the Grand Trunk Railway Company, who on July 1, 1893, fied in company with Michael J. Teedy, a tellow clerk, after stealing \$14,300 in cash belonging to the railway company, was taken into custody at St. Louis, Missouri, yesterday afternoon. Doubtless he has now a far greater respect for the law and its power than he had when he fled, onfident in his expectation of finding a orner of this great earth where he could live without fear. In this hope he was sadly mistaken, as have been many another defaulter during the past twelve months. Detective Day of the Grand Trunk will leave for St. Louis this morning to bring Fraser back, he having signified his inten-tion of returning without the formality of

extradition. Michael Teedy, Fraser's partner in the crime, has not yet been brought within the meshes of the law, but the authorities have a good idea where he is located and it is expected he will be in custody within a few days.

Fraser and Teedy had been employed in Mr. Carlaw's office for a period of eight years. Both were about 24 years of age and single, and well known in the city, their fathers being John Fraser, G. T. 




