The Sash an Attractive Factor
In Summer Frocks.

THE NEW PORCH FURNITURE.

Baronial Brown the Latest Approved Shade—Sun Has Less Effect Upon It Than Green or Pale Tints—Paper Party For the Kiddies.

Dear Elsa—You know, or probably you may not know, what an important factor the sash is going to be on frocks this summer. And for this reason I am sending you news of the latest girly fixings—the new folded waist bands of soft satin which will be worn with day and evening dresses. A simple sash of this kind that I am making is of broad black satin ribbon merely folded around the waist and fastened at the back, where it is met by a flat panel of the satin stitched on the belt so that it hangs down straight at the back to about twenty inches from the hem of the skirt. This perpendicular panel of the ribbon is bordered with a jet fringe, and I have worked a design in jet beads above the hem of the panel.

Another stunning belt that I am making for a white voile frock is of rather heavy white satin ribbon, which goes straight around the waist and finishes at the back in two short ends, each terminating in a point. In each point a design of sun rays is carried out in soft, dull emerald green beads. The sash is bordered with a tiny frilling of emerald green velvet. When making a beaded pattern it is best and easiest to thread the beads on sewing silk, these being carried along the design and sewed to it with another needle threaded with fine silk. Many of the quaint sashes have long tassels of beads at the ends. Indeed, they are reminiscent of the knitted purses of our great-grandmothers' days, which were made of steel beads and finished with long tassels.

Porch Furniture.

You wrote me that you were going to buy green rustic porch furniture. Now, if you want to be in the front rank of fashion get baronial brown, which is a much newer and smarter color. It wears much better, too, the sun having less effect upon it, and even the paper furniture is being stained this rich brown. Paper furniture, you say? Aghast at such a notion? Well, this furniture is not a joke, but a very attractive reality, and very likely you have sat in a paper chair without knowing it and found it quite comfortable at that. You may have taken it for willow, for the two are not unlike in appearance.

The paper is treated by a special chemical process, twisted into strong strands and made up into all kinds of usual shapes in furniture. Then it is stained and given an unusually good coat of a certain brand of varnish, and there you have a handy chair or table of conventional appearance, water-proof, durable and ready for any ordinary usage.

A little oddity in porch furnishings that will come in handy when there are guests on lawn or porch is the lemonade "moat," a sort of wide basket with a handle made of the same material as the rest of the furniture, be it willow, paper or the prairie grass varieties. The "moat" has a large space in the center to hold the lemonade pitcher, jug or thermos bottle and a series of rings—usually about ten—around this to hold glasses. For an informal lawn party this little contrivance is extremely convenient.

And, in connection with paper, why not give Rosalie on her birthday a "paper party" and you will afford the tots the time of their lives.

All the guests should be asked to wear paper costumes over the plainest of muslin foundations or old substantial dresses, and your favors should be of paper. Naturally if there is a spread for the kiddies—the table decorations, napkins, ice cases, candy baskets, etc., should be of paper.

A lamp shade costume would be very cute for Rosalie to wear, and a dress of this kind is easy to make, consisting as it does of printed Japanese paper over plain colored frills with a paper ruche to border the bodice and skirt.

Or perhaps you would prefer a "Christmas cracker" dress, which is quite original. This costume has a rather full bodice and plain skirt tied to tightly at the waist with ribbons. The skirt is cut in a deep fringe over a different colored red petticoat, and the sleeves are fringed likewise. Yours devotedly,

to yield, and the work will be found much less difficult.

Accurate placing and pinning together of seams, etc., are most important when making up a dress. The right and left sides, too, must be made to match unless the figure is badly one sided, when a special fitting of both sides will be necessary.

Put the skirt on, fasten it round the waist, then, standing erect, get some one to mark at intervals with a piece of chalk the exact place where the skirt touches the floor. Remove the skirt and turn up the required hem (two or three inches from the ground being a most comfortable length in wear) beyond the chalk mark, measuring carefully all round.

The New Silk Stocking.

There is a new silk stocking which is warranted not to "run" in the aggravating "ladders" which are so difficult to darn neatly and which, darned or undarned, ruin the effect of the stocking. The top of the stocking, where the garter is attached is woven separately and is attached to the sheer thread silk portion by a strong machine stitch past which the possible "ladder" caused by the garter cannot get. Fresh colored silk hose or a pale champagne color are smarter than black now with the neatly fitting buttoned boot of satin, buckskin or dull calf.
