—They-by-election in Newfoundland, which took place last week, resulted as we anticipated, in the defeat of the Wesleyan candidate.

Thus the poor fellow who had so many difficulties to overcome in reaching his constituency has met with disappointing results in the end. It will be remembered that in order to reach the scene of the contest, a constituency on the extreme north-west coast, he came to Halifax from St. John's, took the train to Sydney, C. B., and there chartered a tug for the scene of operations, going, we presume, by the way of the Strait of Belle Isle.

And, after all this, he finds himself rather badly beaten, and that, too, in a constituency which his brother, ex-speaker Emerson, carried with a majority of several hundreds at the general election, about a year ago.

The result of this election, which is likely to influence to a considerable extent those who take place in the coming general election, seems to point to the complete success of the new government. Indeed the triumph of Mr. Morris and his associates has already been complete and almost general.

A little over a year ago the opposition consisted of a handful of men in a rather discredited and demoralized condition, who were the Government of the Legislature and the Government of the Province.
