**THE LIFE AND ADVENTURES OF SIMON SEEK.**—This is a Canadian Story, inasmuch as it was written in Canada. It possesses merit of no common order, and shows that the author can take a very respectable place among the writers of the day. The work is both instructive and amusing.

The Election Contest, a parallel of that celebrated one at Russell, is well told; the sketches of Canadian Politics are admirable; and the portraits of Canadian Politicians, with the scene in the Legislative Assembly, are done to life.

A little more knowledge of actual life in the back-woods would have saved our author some errors: but taking *Simon Seek* as a whole, it is a book of merit, and as such we wish it a hearty welcome.—*Commercial Advertiser, Montreal.*

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
