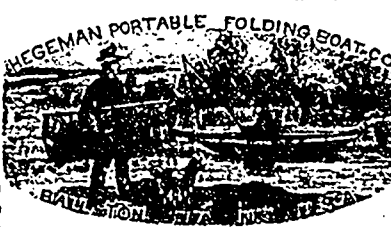

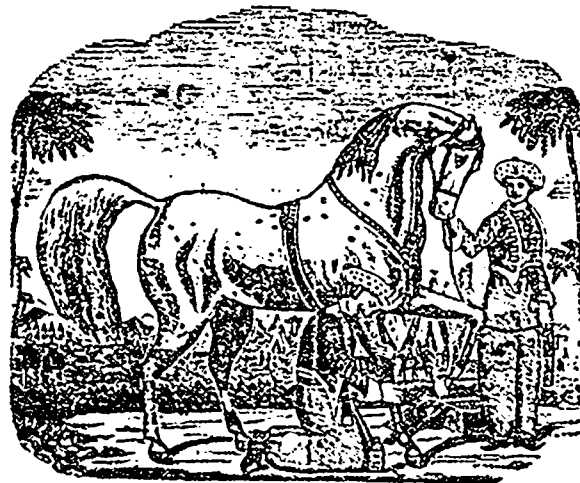

Oct. 12, 13 & 14.

FIRST DAY.

1:00 Trot—Purse \$125; mile heats, 2 in 4, \$30 to first, 35 to second. 2:15 Trot—Purse \$200; mile heats, 3 in 5, to harness, \$125 to first, 75 to second.

SECOND DAY.

3:00 Trot—Purse \$150; mile heats, 3 in 5, to harness; \$100 to first, 50 to second. 2:15 Trot—Purse \$175; mile heats, 3 in 5, to harness, \$125 to first, 50 to second. Half-mile Run—Purse \$75; 3 in 5, catch weights; \$50 to first, 25 to second.

THIRD DAY.

2:30 Trot—Purse \$300; mile heats, 3 in 5, to harness; \$200 to first, 100 to second. Free for all Run—Purse \$175; mile heats, 2 in 4, \$125 to first, 50 to second.

RULES.

All trotting races to be governed by rules of National Association. Running races by rules of Dominion Association.

Entrance Fee 10 cents on amount of purse. Entrance Fee to accompany nomination in all cases.

Heats in each day's races may be run or trotted alternately.

Where distance is the field of any part thereof, shall be entitled to first money only.

In all races four entries to fill and two to start.

Entries will close at Royal Exchange Hotel, Chatham, Oct. 11 at 10 o'clock p.m.

Persons protesting a horse must deposit with the Treasurer 10 per cent. of purse before protest will be entertained.

All horses eligible 1st Aug. 1877.

Admission to track 25 cents. Tickets for entire meeting, admitting holder to track and stand, \$1.00, carriages, 25c.

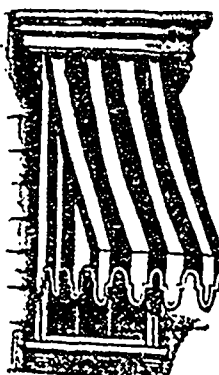

FIRST DAY.

TUESDAY, Sept. 28th—Trotting—Purse \$150; \$100 to first, 40 to second, 10 to third. Open to all horses that never beat 2:30 prior to Sept. 18, 1875.

Running—Purse \$125—One and an eighth mile, single dash, \$100 and entrance returned to first, 25 and entrance returned to second. Entrance only \$5. To carry 100 lbs, with an allowance of 7 lbs to all horses bred in the Dominion of Canada, and to all horses that have not won a race this season.

SECOND DAY.

WEDNESDAY, Sept. 29—Hurdle Race—Purse \$250—Two mile dash, over 8 hurdles 3 ft. 6 in. high; \$185 and entrance returned to first, 50 and entrance returned to second, 15 and entrance returned to third. Entrance only \$5. Handicap; weight to be announced Sept. 27.

Trotting—Purse \$350—\$225 to first, 100 to second, 25 to third; open to all horses that never beat 2:35 prior to Sept. 18, 1875.

Running—Purse \$225—\$100 and entrance returned to first, 60 and entrance returned to second. Entrance only \$10; mile heats, 2 in 3.

THIRD DAY.

THURSDAY, Sept. 30—Trotting—Purse \$550; \$350 to first, 150 to second, 50 to third; open to all.

Running—Purse \$550; \$275 and entrance returned to first, 75 and entrance returned to second. Entrance only \$10; 1 1/2 mile heats, 2 in 3. The winner of the mile heat race to carry 7 lbs extra.

Steeplechase—Purse \$350—Over a course about 2 1/2 miles. Handicap. Weights to be announced Sept. 29th, after the Hurdle Race. \$250 and entrance returned to first, 75 and entrance returned to second, 25 and entrance returned to third; entrance only \$5.

Rules and Regulations.

Trotting Races are mile heat, best 3 in 5.
