I noticed in last month's "Record" that in one district in New Brunswick there were several Presbyterian Churches without a Clergyman, whereas if the people were united, two Clergyman could be respectably supported. This certainly looks as if the right of private judgment were running to seed:—as if chaos were to be the result instead of a Church. "What is it all about?" a stranger is inclined to ask; but no one can venture to answer. And we profess to be Christians, to have for the law of our life Christ, who did not seek His own. I would offer a word of advice to merchants in towns who are asked every day to subscribe for new Churches, to be very sure that there is really need before they put their names down. The building a new church is not necessarily a good object.
