Limited; Consolidated-Bathurst Limited. The purpose of the investigation is to determine the most economical and feasible distribution channel or channels for the transportation, warehousing and delivery of newsprint from eastern Canadian mills to the United States.

- 2. Before the investigation was undertaken, other Canadian newsprint producers were approached but only five were in a position at that time to contribute manpower and financial support. If intensive studies now under way indicate that there are significant transportation and warehousing cost savings to be achieved, other Canadian newsprint manufacturers will be urged to join in the formation of a non-profit distribution company. All Canadian rail carriers will be eligible to compete for the tonnage to be shipped by the distribution company.
- 3. The Chairman of Newsprint Distribution Research is Mr. J. P. Lunderville, the Project Director is Mr. S. French. Both have had many years experience in the manufacturing and distribution of forest products with Canadian companies.

At any time during the production process of the June, 1970 issue of the Labour Gazette, or subsequent to the production process, were copies destroyed and the issue reprinted and, if so (a) what was the reason (b) was any material which appeared in the first production not included in the second and, if so, what was the nature of this material?

Hon. John C. Munro (Minister of Labour): (a). The first printing of the June 1970 issue of the Labour Gazette was not distributed because the author of a short article failed to clearly identify the source of the editorial opinion quoted therein. (b) Yes, the material mentioned in (a), concerning autonomy of Canadian unions.

CHARGES LAID AGAINST "TOYO MARU" AND ITS CAPTAIN Question No. 380—Mr. Munro (Esquimalt-Saanich):

Mr. William Rompkey (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of Fisheries): 1. Yes, against the vessel master.
