Mr. Tolmie, from the Standing Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs, presented the Eighth Report of the said Committee, which is as follows:

Pursuant to its Order of Reference of Tuesday, February 17, 1970, your Committee has considered Bill C-29, An Act respecting Canada Day, and has agreed to report it with the following amendments:

Clause 1

Substitute the words "*Confederation Day*" for the words "*Canada Day*" in lines 4 and 5.

Clause 2

Substitute the words "*Confederation Day*" for the words "*Canada Day*" in line 8.

Clause 3

Substitute for Clause 3 the following clause:

Legal
holiday

"3. Throughout Canada the first day of July shall be a legal holiday and shall be kept and observed as such, except that in any year when the first day of July falls on a Sunday, the second day of July shall, in lieu thereof, be a legal holiday and be kept and observed as such."

Add, immediately after Clause 3, the following clause:
