Special to The Toronto World. KINGSTON, Ont., June 3 .- The af ternoon session of the Presbyterian Assembly was given over to the recelving of reports. These reports were read and adopted: Home mis sions (eastern section); home mis sions (western section); augmenta tion east; Dr. Robertson memorial The report of the committee on the revision of the Book of Praise was read, but left over for further discus sion. In discussing the revision of the Book of Praise, Rev. Dr. Herridge, every reason to congratulate itself. "While the war is on we can fight better with the best hymn books," The fact that charges of heresy had been made against W. like sending dirty linen to the assembly to be washed. D. A. McLean, of Ripley, declared that it was time the assembly investigated such things. He believed that there were many presbyteries which were altogether too lax in their granting of licenses to mer to preach the word of God.

Home Missions Report.
Owing to the war and the failure of crops in certain parts of the west, the Mission Board reported a deficit of \$137,631. The board had been committed to work on a much larger scale than formerly. The reserve fund was drawn on for \$50,000 and the difference, \$87,631 carried as a deficit. During the present year the whole ome mission organization is being used to bring aid, receiving churches up to the highest possible point of self support.

Seven thousand, nine hundred and sixty eight Presbyterian immigrants instructor on the land machines. arrived and were welcomed by the chaplains at the ports. Sixteen hund-red came to Toronto. As immigration has practically ceased the immigra-tion chaplains will now minister to some of the mission charges.

Mission to Jews. Toronto's mission to the 35,000 Jews is stat, to be well organized but understaffed.

A Presbyterian mission to the Jews in Montreal was, established during the year. Of 60,000 Jews in that city, only seating capacity is provided in the synagogues for 8,000, which leaves over 50,000 with no religions provision made for them by their own faith. Over 500 students offered their services to the board this spring, and 364

were assigned to mission fields Notable contributions to the Home Mission Fund were \$4,800 from the American Presbyterian Church, Mont-real; \$3,714 from the United Free Church of Scotland, and \$989 from the Presbyterian Church of Ireland.
Public Worship.

The committee on public worship and aids to devotion report that the publication of the book for family wor-ship has been delayed owing to the war. It is now hoped to place the book before the church concurrently with the revised edition of the Book of Praise. With regard to the preparation of a book of order for the administration of the sacraments, the committee recommend that a book for voluntary use be prepared.

Addresses on home mission were delivered at tonight's session of the Presbyterian assembly. Rev. Mr. Respoke on the Jewish Presbyterian Mission in Toronto, Rev. J. D Byrnes, superintendent of missions in northern Ontario; Rev. J. E. Tanner. district superintendent in Quebec Pro vince, and Rev. Colin Young, district superintendent of Saskatchewan, were the other speakers.
