HAMILTON HAS PASSED COMPENSATION BY-LAW Will Now Be Able to Approach Legislature for Permission to Indemnify Hotelkeepers.

HAMILTON, Nov. 14.—(Special.)—At the meeting of the city council this evening, Controller Allen's hoteliers' compensation by-law was accepted by the aldermen and controllers. Ald. Morris asked that the by-law be referred back to committee, because he wanted to speak to it. This Controller Allen was unwilling to do. Ald. Morris then asked who it was that was to do the compensating, if the hoteliers who had the license to keep out of it, or the people Controller Allen said that they wanted to pass the by-law, so as to be able to approach the legislature, and get permission to compensate. It would be for the city council to decide who was to put up the compensation.

UNIQUE ADDITIONS TO UNIVERSITY MUSEUM

Sir Edmund Walker Presents Splendid Specimen of Pre-Historic Reptile and Some of Fossils.

One of the most unostentatious, but not the least valuable of the public benefactions of some of the leading citizens of Toronto was marked last night by a simple ceremony in the Museum of Geology and Mineralogy in the Chemistry and Mining Building of the University, at the head of McCaul-st., when Sir Edmund Walker, on behalf of several donors, presented to the university an excellent specimen of a pre-historic coryphaeus, an insect of the Cretaceous of Kansas, in plain insectary, 17 feet long, which was found in the chalk cliffs of Kansas, and is said to be about five million years old.

GIRL WANTED TO DIE TELLS PECULIAR STORY Claims to Be Daughter of Former Toronto Business Man, Who Recently Abandoned Her.

DETROIT, Nov. 14.—(Special.)—Fathos and mystery mingle in the weird attempt of Esther Carlson, employed as a maid in the home of Charles Ritter, 134 West Bethune-ave., to kill her mother, 124 West Bethune-ave., while alone in the house, the girl resorted to, to give life the appearance of having been murdered by a burglar, then she turned on all the burners of the kitchen range, and waited for death.
