## TORONTO'S GOOD SHOWING DEFEAT MONTREALERS

Big Crowd See Game at Scarborough  
—Tecumsehs Win at Ottawa  
—Lacrosse News.

Toronto and Montreal battled on Saturday at Scarborough Beach before nearly 700 people, the largest crowd to witness a lacrosse match in Toronto this season. The blue and white were returned the victors by 8-2.

The Toronto team as a whole settled down to work, showed the result of the hard week's practice, and put up the best

exhibition of lacrosse so far shown by the team. The field in particular was brilliant, and in this department the home players were much better than the visitors. The defence also put up a great game, and the fast Montreal home were kept well out, barring possibly the first quarter.

The fast work of the fielders kept the Toronto home well fed with the ball, and as the game progressed they made excellent use of it, outscoring and outplaying the visitors.

The two Scotts played well, but were too closely checked to be as effective as usual. Kane was good at centre, as always was Thompson. Brennan stopped well at goal, the majority of the scores being made with the player almost on top of him.

Montreal scored the first goal of the

match after some nice combination play in which Roberts finally found the net. Toronto soon evened up, when Kall scored on a fast pass from Warwick. With Powers on the fence, Leyden made it 2-1 for the visitors by quarter-time.

Cameron narrowly missed on a pass from Warwick at the commencement of the third quarter. Both goaltenders made

some good stops, but Toronto's defense was playing a very strong game. Cullen was scored after Dando had made him run and a good pass from Thompson to Warwick and Dando kept their clever fielding, and Kalls put his team ahead by a neat shot after a pass from the former, making the score a hat-trick for Toronto.

The last half of the game was hard fought all the way, with Toronto having the better of the play. The visitors were unable to get the ball past Byrne, while the home team were unable to find more goals, making the final score: Toronto 3, Montreal 2.
