Belgian Artillery Silences

Paris, Feb. 18.—The Belgian official communiqué tonight reads: "On Feb. 17 our artillery silenced several batteries and bombed enemy organizations near St. Georges, Dixmude, Wille and Kluiter School. The enemy directed artillery fire against our positions and communications in the regions of Jambacq, Pervyse, Casteleker, St. Jacques-Philippe and Merckem. There was slight artillery activity during the night of Feb. 17-18. The Germans attempted to approach one of our posts south of Dixmude and were repulsed."
