CATHOLICS OF HAMILTON RECEIVE POPE'S BLESSING

Special Cable Message for Jubilee—Mgr. Sbarretti on the Educational Problem.

Hamilton, May 20.—(Special).—Today the Roman Catholics of the Diocese of Hamilton commenced a celebration in honor of the golden jubilee of the consecration of the cathedral of St. Mary's. The celebration was held at 5.30 p.m. by Mgr. Sbarretti, the apostolic delegate. Only the clergy were admitted to this service. His excellency was assisted by Bishop McEvay, London; Rev. Father Coty, Hamilton; Rev. Father McColl, Peterboro; Rev. Father Waechter, St. Jerome's College; Rev. Dr. Kleopfer, superior rector; Rev. Father Mahony, rector of the cathedral. His excellency also celebrated the pontifical high mass at 10.30. M. G. O'Reilly and Wm. Kavanagh presented an address to his excellency on behalf of the clergy and laity of the diocese. Bishop Dowling also gave the delegate an address of welcome. The Pope cabled a special blessing to the Bishop of the diocese. This evening Archbishop O'Connor, Toronto, gave pontifical vespers. In reply to the address presented by the man who has been masquerading under the title of "Acton's Unknown," and who defeated Conkie Friday night, says that his name is Fred L. Earl of Rochester.
