WHEAT LESS BUOYANT BUT IS STILL STEADY

Bradstreet's World's Visible Shows Large Increase—Liverpool Cables Are Stronger.

Receipts of live stock at the City Market were 85 carloads since last Friday, as reported by the railways, composed of 1287 cattle, 800 hogs, 2180 sheep and lambs, with 86 calves.

Chicago Cattle.

Ennis & Stoppin wired to J. L. Mitchell: Wheat opened a shade higher in sympathy with the Chicago news, but it soon developed that cash houses were not buying the demands of commission houses and stimulated some bearish traders to aggression, but on the whole the selling decline from 7 3/4 to 7 1/2 c. for May. From the latter figure the selling element sold a little lower, and when an attempt was made later to cover there was a partial recovery, which caused a partial recovery during the day was better than the market required constant support, and it is a difficult matter for friends of the cereal to secure profits without causing loss of ground gained. There does not seem to be anything in prospect to cause other than a scalping market during the balance of the year, and we would advise friends to take advantage of the sharp decline to sell on.

Feeder and Stockers.
