LORDS PASS BILL.

Marriage With Deceased Wife's Sister
Legalized in Britain.

London, Aug. 27.—Marriage with a
deceased wife's sister has finally be-
come legalized in Great Britain, the
House of Lords last evening having
by 98 to 54 votes, passed the bill mak-
ing such marriages legal.

Goderich Branch Opened.

Goderich, Aug. 27.—The opening of
the railway service on the Guelph and
Goderich branch of the C. P. R. took
place yesterday morning.
The whole town was en fete and
the station platform and river banks
crowded with citizens as the first
train glided around the high banks of
the Maitland, Goderich's "scenic
route."

The conductor in charge of the
train was Peter McDonald, and the
engineer Hugh Davidson. A large
number of passengers left for Toronto
and Montreal on the first train.

Rain Saves Village.

Kingston, Aug. 27.—A much-long-
ed-for rain fell on Saturday and stay-
ed the bush fires raging about Par-
ham, and gave the residents a breath-
ing space after 48 hours of constant
watchfulness and fighting of the
flames.
The fires kept creeping towards the
village, and barns and buildings were
constantly in danger, but heroic work
kept the fire back.

Chatham Man Arrested.

Detroit, Mich., Aug. 27.—Albert
Toussaint of Chatham was arrested
here and taken to Chatham Sunday,
charged with a serious offence against
a young girl, daughter of B. Bellare
of Dover Township. The man was
taken back to Chatham for trial.

Foot Badly Crushed.

St. Catharines, Aug. 27.—A G. T. R.
brakeman named Chas. Dawes is in
the hospital as the result of an acci-
dent early yesterday morning, in
which one foot was so badly crushed
that it may have to be amputated.
