Washington, D. C., Nov. 28.—Mr. Francis M. Hatch, the representative from Hawaii to the United States, has returned to the city after a long absence. The minister was asked for an interview upon prospects of a renewal during the incoming Administration of Re McGowan, Walkerton. steps for the annexation of Hawaii to the United States. Mr. Hatch declined to talk on the subject, but referred his questioner to the resolution passed by the Legislature of Hawaii in May last as showing the attitude of his Government on the subject. The

resolution (without the preamble) is as follows: "Resolved, by the Senate and House of Representatives, that the Legislature of the Republic of Hawali continue to be as hereafter firmly and steadfastly in favor of the annexation of the Hawaiian Islands to the United States of America, and in advocating such policy, they feel assured that they are expressing not only their own sen-

timents but those of the voters of the republic. In this connection it will be recalled that just before the close of the last Administration Secretary of State Foster negotiated a treaty with a commission from Hawaii for the annexation of that country to the United States. It was sent to the Senate by President Harrison, but was not acted on during

his administration.

After President Cleveland came into office, and before the Senate had disposed of the treaty, the former with-drew it. The document not having been ratified by this Government, nothing was done by the Hawaiians.
