

WHEAT STILL SOARS. **OFFERINGS SCARCE** 

Leading Chicago Houses Refuse Contracts for Delivery This Month.

SOUEEZE IN "OCTOBER" MAI CALL FUR ACTION

Few Thousand Bushels of Wheat Change Hands at Big Advance.

Winnipeg, May 11.—A situation is developing in the October wheat contract in Winnipeg, which is likely to call for some official action by the exchange authorities in the near future. The price scaled up 13c above yesterday's record level this morning, and on the whole advance only a few thousand bushels changed hands. The morning peak was \$2.30 per bushel, which is nearly \$1 a bushel higher than ever before recorded for that delivery at this time of the year. The movement was started by unfavorable crop news. The fall delivery was the strongest in all markets, and in Winnipeg October moved farter than September at either Chicago or Minneapolis.

An advance of 6c per bushel was scored in practically all spot quotations of wheat,

shippers and exporters bought No. 6. Spreads were unchanged and offerings were unsatisfactory, considering the reight of prices. The oat market was dead. There was a good demand for barley and somewhat more interest was shown in flax.

Find No Trail of Graft In Ice-Breaker's Transfer

Cornwall, May 11.—No sales were recorded on the Cornwall cheese board this afternoon, firms not wishing to stock up until ware definite information relative to the price proposed to be set is forthcoming. The offerings were 806 colored and 312 white, a total of 1,118 for this week. With last week's offering of 1,241, which was also boarded, the total was 2,359. The board will meet again next Friday, it being expected the situation will be cleared by then.
