My own opinion is that there are many people who are attending St. Paul's whose names and addresses are unknown to the Clergy.

There can be no doubt I think, but that there is a growing interest and an increasing attendance at the Church services, and every month we are able to chronicle in the Parish and Home new additions to the Church List.
