LAST NEWS OF DAY FROM BATTLE SCENES

Rome, Aug. 24.—General Cadorna announced that the Italians yesterday stormed new Austrian positions, broke up violent counterattacks made by Austro-Hungarian prisoners.
London, Aug. 24.—The admiralty states that no British ships were hit by bombs dropped in the Zeppelin raid, a German official report to the contrary.
Rome, Aug. 24.—More than 20,000 prisoners have been removed from the Austro-Italian front by the Italians.

THE DESNA TORPEDOED

A South American Port, Aug. 28.—A despatch received here from Rio Janeiro says there are persistent, but unconfirmed, rumors in circulation that the Royal Mail Steam Packet Company's steamer Desna has been torpedoed. The ship registers 11,400 tons and was built in 1912.

GERMANS ADMIT IT

Berlin, Aug. 24.—The evacuation by the Germans of Hill 404, a famous stronghold on the Verdun front, is announced by the war office. It is said a weak garrison was left there.

Russian Report

Petrograd, Aug. 24.—The Russian official statement issued today makes mention of fighting in the Biga region, saying that on the Russian front there were only failures and scouting operations. On the Romanian front the Austro-Germans last night attacked the Russo-Romanian positions near the village of Krendshien and after occupying part of the trenches of the defenders were ejected by a counter-attack.

Further Italian Successes

Rome, Aug. 24.—The war office reports that the battle on the Isonzo front continues, and that about sixty guns have been captured.

Chicago, Aug. 24.—Wheat today kept to its recent dull routing with occasional transactions of an evening up character. The opening was three cents higher, September price being \$2.10. Later trades were at a decline of two cents.

SAYS RICH HAVE EVADED THE TAXES

Senator Lewis Declares Government Has Been Cheated Out of \$300,000,000 by False Reports on Incomes

Washington, Aug. 24.—Charges that the government has been defrauded out of fully \$300,000,000 in income taxes evaded by the wealthy were made in the senate by Senator Lewis of Illinois, who declared the treasury department had the proofs.

Senator Lewis was speaking in support of Senator Gerry's amendment to the war tax bill greatly to increase taxes on big incomes.

"There has been," he said, "inconceivable ingenious lying on the income tax schedules before the finance committee that would in other forums subject those responsible to perjury."

"In the treasury department at this hour is proof of \$800,000,000 swindled out of the government by fraud, perjury, deception and other different forms of criminal conduct on the part of the wealthy."

Senator Lewis also said that had "this set of very wealthy men" shown fidelity and honesty in making their income tax returns, the government would, in part, have had ample funds for preparedness purposes.

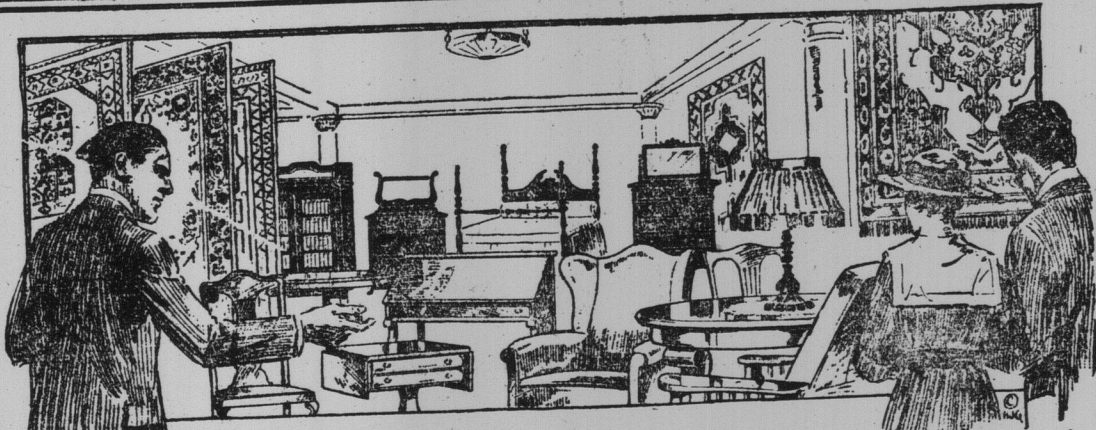
