## Lloyd George Gives Promise Of Reprisals For Air-Raids

Murderers of Women and Children to MAKE TEST OF Find Country "Bombed With Compound Interest" — Germans Now Expecting It

London, Oct. 3-A crowd of poor people in the southwest district of London yesterday appealed to Premier Lloyd George, says the Daily Mail, for reprisals against Germany for the air raids on London. The premier shouted to the crowd:

"WE WILL GIVE IT ALL BACK TO THEM SOON. WE SHALL BOMB GERMANY WITH COMPOUND INTEREST."

The crowd cheered the promise of the premier wildly. The pre mier had just completed a tour of the area damaged in the raids with Viscount French, commander of the home forces.

London, Oct. 8.—That the British government contemplates some new and effective steps to counteract German air raids on England is borne out in speeches by Major-General Sir Francis Lloyd, director of the defenses of London, and Dr. Addison, former minister of munitions, at a meeting in the London district yesterday called to discuss the recent raids. Dr. Addison remarked that the Germans had got the start of humanity in the different forms of ruthlessness, such as sinking unarmed ships with submarines and bombing open with submarines and bombing open towns.
