THOUSANDS WILL GREET ROOSEVELT

Plans for Welcome Home On Saturday

MET AT QUARANTINE

Will Be Transferred to Revenue Cutter and Arrived at Battery—Twenty Thousand People on Parade, Two Million to See It

New York, June 15—The preparations for the city's welcome to Theodore Roosevelt on his arrival at New York next Saturday are practically completed.

Col. Roosevelt, accompanied by Mrs. Roosevelt, Mrs. Nicholas Longworth, Ethel and Kermit Roosevelt, are expected to arrive at quarantine at 9 o'clock on Saturday morning.

An hour before that time the revenue cutter Androscoggin, bearing the mayor's commission of 200, the governors here for the occasion, and a few other notable guests, the Nassau, carrying the Roosevelt Neighbors' Association of Oyster Bay and a hundred or more other steamers, large and small will start for quarantine.

As soon as the Hamburg-American liner Kaiserin Augusta Victoria comes to anchor Col. Roosevelt will be transferred to the Androscoggin.

Other members of the family will be placed on the revenue cutter Manhattan.

As soon as these transfers are made the Androscoggin, escorted by police boats, will take her place at the head of a double column of excursion steamers, private yachts and tug.

The ships will sail up the west side of the Hudson to a station at Pier A, Battery street. This anchored, the parade will come close in on the Manhattan side.

Col. Roosevelt will land at Pier A, Battery street, where he will be received by Mayor Gaynor. A stand will be erected there with a seating capacity of 500, to accommodate the official guests, and the mayor's committee.

Afterwards the land parade will start. The Roosevelt Rough Riders, commanded by Charles E. Hunter, Oklahoma City, will lead, preceded by a squadron of police and the police band.

Following the Rough Riders will be the carriage containing Colonel Roosevelt, Mayor Gaynor and Cornelius Vanderbilt, chairman of the reception committee.

This will be followed by the Spanish-American war veterans, about 6,000 in number, as an escort to the committee in charge. The line of march will be up Battery Place to Broadway up Broadway to Water Place, then to Fifth Avenue and up the avenue to 59th street, where the parade will disband.

(Bangor Commercial) When Col. Roosevelt arrives in New York next Saturday there will be 20,000 people in the parade and at least 2,000,000 will gather to witness it.

FIGHT WILL BE HELD, SAYS MAYOR

Frisco's Chief Magistrate Hurls Defiance at Governor

Legal Contest Likely But General View is Knock-out Blow for Ring Contests in California—Reno, Ely and Salt Lake City Being Considered But Promoters Say They're Out a Lot of Money

San Francisco, June 16—Gov. J. M. Gillett's message to Attorney General Webb invoking the arm of the law to put a question on the Jeffries-Johnson and the Langford-Kaufmann contests, are generally regarded as a knockout blow to the fight game in California.

A vigorous struggle to defeat the governor's attempt to stop the big fight is in prospect, however, Mayor McCarthy has announced that he will consent to the issue of the promoters. Promoter Gleason says that attorneys have advised him to go ahead with the arrangements for holding the contest in San Francisco.

Attorney General Webb said today: "My final word is that I am going to carry out the governor's instructions. I am going to stop the fight."

Whether the fight will stand by Gleason in contesting the governor's order has not yet been stated. "If we can't fight in San Francisco then we will go to Reno or Ely, Nevada, or Salt Lake City," he said.

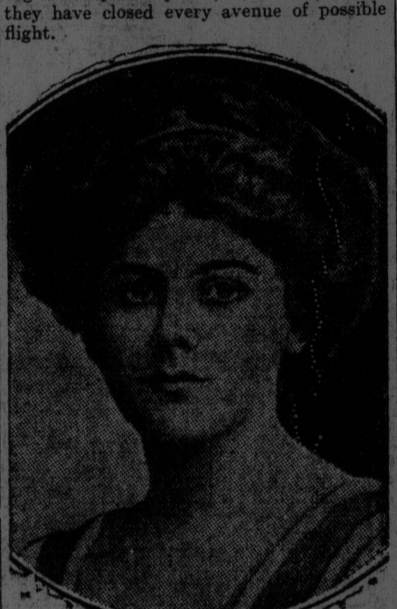
