CHAMPION OYSTER SHUCKER.

New Orleans Oyster Wins Southern Contest With 4,944 in Five Hours.

New Orleans, Feb. 2.—Mike Algero of New Orleans won the oyster shucking championship of the south here by opening a total of 4,944 oysters in five hours and fifty-five minutes. There were six other contestants. Algero used the "hammer" method.

Bill Smith of New Orleans was second, his count being 4,887, while Joe Piccoli, also of New Orleans, was third with 4,897. In addition to cash prizes of \$50, \$35 and \$15 for first, second and third places, local oyster dealers presented to the winners valuable prizes.

The contest, held under the auspices of the local Association of Oystermen, was to determine the champion oyster opener of the south and was the result of claims recently made by Baltimore men that they had the fastest shuckers in the world. Efforts will be made to match Algero against a representative of a Maryland city dealer for the championship of the United States.

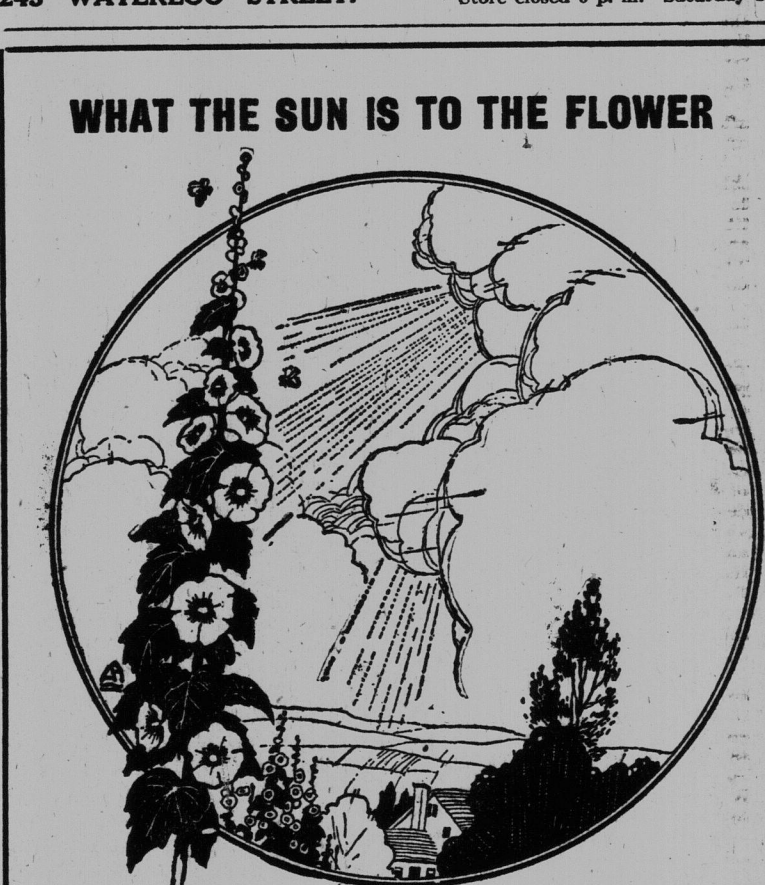
