STEFANSSON ARCTIC

Ottawa, March 3—Circumstances surrounding the Stefansson Arctic expedition of 1913-1918 are likely to form the subject of investigation. Recently scientific members of the southern party of the expedition made strong charges against Vilhjalmur Stefansson, leader of the expedition, saying that they had been misrepresented in Stefansson's last book, "The Friendly Arctic," the scientific men returned with counter-representations of extravagance and the view is current that the accusations may not be allowed to rest.

It is understood that the scientific men are urging investigation into the charges made against them in "The Friendly Arctic;" but if undertaken, the inquiry would probably be more general and cover the conduct of the expedition as a whole.

U. S. Planning to Instal Med- FINE PROGRAMME IN ical Service to Supersede Present Methods.


Washington, March 4.—One of the blg radio companies in conjunction with the public health service, is planning to install a radio phone medical service from shore to ships which do not carry doctors. This has been made known following the radio telephone conference called and presided over by Secretary Hoover.

Most steamers under the heavy tonnage class and carrying relatively small crews, do not carry ships' doctors. When an accident occurs to any one on board the injured person usually is given crude first aid treatment by the captain or one of his mates.

Under the projected new system, when a man is injured, the ship, equipped with an inexpensive radio phone, will send out a distress signal to the nearest public health service station.




